Differences between the

Rapture and the Second Coming

- Jesus coming for His Church/Bride up to Heaven, before tribulation
 - John 14:1-3
 - 1 Thessalonians 1:10, 4:14-17, 5:9
 - Revelation 3:10

- Jesus coming with His Church/Bride down from Heaven, after the tribulation
 - Zechariah 14:5
 - Colossians 3:4
 - Revelation 19:7-8, 14, 21:9-10
 - Matthew 24:29-31
 - Jude 14-15
 - 1 Thessalonians 3:13

- Caught up with Him in the air, in the clouds
 - 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

- Jesus' feet touch the earth, and he brings war, then peace.
 - Zechariah 14:4
 - Revelation 19:11-21

- Appears to Believers only
 - Matthew 5:8
 - John 11:40
 - Hebrews 9:28

- Every eye will see him, including unbelievers
 - Revelation 1:7
 - Zechariah 12:10
 - Matthew 24:30
 - Luke 3:6
 - John 19:37

- Christians taken first, unbelievers are left behind a shut door
 - Matthew 25:1-13
 - Revelation 3:8-10
 - Revelation 4:1
 - 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

- Wicked are taken first, the righteous (Tribulation saints) are left to populate the millennium
 - Matthew 13:28-30

- Purpose: To present the Church to Himself and to the Father in Heaven
 - 2 Corinthians 11:2
 - Revelation 19:6-9

- Purpose: To execute judgment on earth and set up His Kingdom on earth
 - Zechariah 14:3-4
 - Jude 1:14-15
 - Revelation 19:11-21

- Purpose: to reveal the man of sin in the Tribulation
 - 2 Thessalonians 2

- Purpose: to cast Satan to the bottomless pit, to bind Satan after the Tribulation
 - Revelation 20:1-7

- Happens in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, no war, globally.
 - 1 Corinthians 15:52

- Slow coming, at war, to specific locations, from Edom, to Bozrah, to Meggido or Armageddon, to Jerusalem.
 - Isaiah 63:1-3
 - Revelation 16:16
 - Zechariah 12:9-10

<u>Rapture</u>

- Christians are changed, and get glorified bodies, go to heaven and do not marry, and become immortal.
 - Matthew 22:30
 - 1 Corinthians 15:52
 - 1 John 3:2

- People populate the earth during the millennium; some people still die, not being changed to immortality as at the rapture.
 - Isaiah 65:20

- Jesus descends with a shout (for resurrection) and trumpet noise
 - 1 Thessalonians 4:16

- No shout mentioned
 - Revelation 19:11-21

- A Resurrection takes place of all saints to immortality, to rule as kings and priests
 - 1 Corinthians 15:51-54
 - 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

- Resurrection of the martyred tribulation saints to immortality who worship day and night in the temple of God
 - Revelation 7:15
 - Revelation 20:4-6

<u>Rapture</u>

- Occurs as a thief in the night, at the 'no man knows the day or hour' festival of the Feast of Trumpets.
 - 1 Corinthians 15:51-54
 - 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

- Occurs at end of 7 years Tribulation; exact day predicted; 3.5 years or 1260 days after the abomination of desolation.
 - Daniel 9:24-27, 12:11-12
 - Revelation 11:2, 12:6,14, 13:5

- Is likened to the abduction of the bride during the Jewish Wedding, and the union of the bride and groom, which occurs at the start of the 7 day bridal week.
 - Genesis 29:22-28;
 - Judges 14:1-18

- Is likened to the marriage feast, which occurs after the 7 day bridal week, returning from the wedding.
 - Luke 12:36
 - Revelation 19

- The dead in Christ rise and together with then living will be changed into their new bodies and leave Earth with Jesus
 - 1 Thessalonians 4:14-16

- Christians return with Jesus in already resurrected bodies riding on white horses.
 - Revelation 19:11-21

- Jesus returns as a savior from wrath
 - Luke 21:36
 - Romans 5:9
 - 1 Thessalonians 1:10, 5:9
 - Revelation 3:10

- Jesus returns on a white horse, full of wrath.
 - Revelation 19:11

- For the Church only (those in Christ)
 - 1 Thessalonians 4:14-17

- For redeemed Israel & Gentiles
 - Matthew 25:31-46
 - Mark 13:1
 - Luke 21:5
 - Romans 11:25-27

- A message of hope and comfort
 - 1 Thessalonians 4:18
 - Titus 2:13
 - 1 John 3:3

- A message of judgment and woe
 - Joel 3:12-16
 - Amos 5:18
 - Malachi 4:5
 - Revelation 19:11-21
